Scope

How to use the Framework

Selection Process ALots 1-7 and 11 – Direct Award

This applies to Lots 1 to 7 and Lot 11 only and PROVIDED THAT the Anticipated Contract Value is less than the Works Threshold. To use this process, the Employer must be able to provide a clear statement of its requirements. The Employer establishes objective and transparent Direct Award Criteria which shall be designed to assess which Framework Contractor in the relevant Lot will provide the best price/quality ratio (i.e. best value for money) in relation to the proposed Works. The Employer applies the Direct Award Criteria to the tender submissions of the Framework Contractors on the relevant Lot (i.e. the tenders which they submitted at framework competition stage). The Employer must document the process and the reasons for its decision.

Selection Process BAll Lots – Mini Competition

The Call off Process will be commenced by the Employer issuing a mini competition tender to all Framework Suppliers in the relevant Lot or lots. The Potential Employer will state which Selection Process will be used (Selection Process B (Mini-Tender) or Variant B.1 (Early Contractor Involvement)).

The following weightings may be applied and should be chosen appropriately depending on the complexity of the works and the Employers requirements:

Weightings



100% Price of

90% Price and 10% Quality / Technical

80% Price and **20%** Quality / Technical

70% Price and 30% Quality / Technical

60% Price and **40%** Quality / Technical

50% Price and **50%** Quality / Technical

40% Price and **60%** Quality / Technical

30% Price and **70%** Quality / Technical

20% Price and **80%** Quality / Technical

What are the requirements of Contractors and Employers for the SEWSCAP projects?

There is an increased focus on the delivery of social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being through the way in which the Public Sector manages its procurement activities.

The Framework Contractors have signed a Framework Social Value Charter to support the delivery of the three key Welsh Government Initiatives, these being:

- Opening Doors: the Charter for SME Friendly Procurement seeks to create a fair and open environment in which we can all do business together and address issues of particular concern to SMEs.

Along with any wider associated legislative and policy driven requirements.

The Framework includes a number of Social Value related Key Performance Indicators within its Performance Monitoring and Review Regime which, whilst established at Framework level, will necessarily devolve to individual projects delivered under Call-Off Contracts pursuant to the Agreement. Tenders for Call-Off Contracts may also include Social Value in the scope of their requirements and/or in the award criteria.



Performance Management

In order to ensure the Contractors on the Framework are performing to the required standard, there are a number of Key Performance Indicators which are managed by the Framework Team. The Framework also includes National Skills Academy targets per project. This is designed to ensure that the quality and performance of each Contractor is recorded and reported at the end of each project.
